Statement on California Proposition 65
The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986

To whom it may concern,

The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Cal. Health & Safety Code §§ 25249.5 - 25249.14) was enacted in November 1986 following a successful ballot initiative in the state of California. The statute, also known as Proposition ("Prop") 65, requires California's Governor to maintain a list of chemicals that are "known" to the state to cause cancer, birth defects or any other reproductive harm. The statute prohibits the discharge or release of these chemicals into sources of drinking water and requires certain businesses to provide warnings to California citizens prior to exposing them to chemicals on the list. Warnings are not required when anticipated exposures fall below safe harbor levels. As recognized by California itself, the thresholds for Prop 65 warnings are not necessarily indicators that a product is unsafe or in violation of any product-safety standards or requirements. (https://oag.ca.gov/prop65/faq). Prop 65 does not ban or restrict the use of these substances.

A risk assessment was carried out on the unit referenced above to determine Seifert System's potential obligations, if any, under Prop 65 with regards to potential discharges of listed chemicals to sources of drinking water and as to consumer, environmental and occupational exposures. The results of that assessment have determined that Seifert is not required to provide such warnings.

However, Seifert Systems recognizes that certain end users of its products may have separate and independent obligations under Prop 65 which may require them to provide such warnings to their employees. Accordingly, and in an effort to provide information to assist end users in their own Prop 65 assessments, the below table provides the Prop 65 listed chemicals or substances present in the unit, as identified through supplier feedback and reviews of applicable Safety Datasheets, up to the date of this declaration. The presence of a chemical in the table shown overleaf, does not necessarily mean that the chemical will result in an exposure at a level for which a Prop 65 warning is required.
